"It's amazing how a single decision can affect your life. Just



walking through a door can change everything! It depends on what awaits you on the other side! I will never forget my first time walking through the door at the Lighthouse. I was withdrawing from meth, had broken up with my girlfriend and had lost the will to live. It was that day I met the friends who would support me. I have found a reason not just to keep going, but to get and stay clean. I genuinely look forward to spending the day at the Lighthouse among my friends.

#### Lighthouse Involvement

After weeks of spending time at the Lighthouse, Ryan began contributing his time and labor. For months, Ryan involved himself in daily chores such as hauling supplies and mopping floors - whatever was necessary to ensure our smooth operations. Eventually he took on running the dishwashing operation. Ryan has recently taken on more responsibilities by doing food prep in the kitchen.

#### Update

As many are aware, Ryan experienced a bicycle accident on September 15th that left him with several fractured vertebrae. After just a month, he returned to the Lighthouse. Now, after more than 2 months, his recovery is progressing nicely and he hopes to soon be free of the cumbersome brace that is allowing his neck to heal. We continue to wish him a full recovery.

### **Community Connections**

#### Community Collaborative - Wellness Day - Sep 12

Every month at the Lighthouse brings new opportunities for collaboration and cooperation. Recently we participated in an afternoon event where more than 50 state and local agencies came together to provide information about services available on a variety of topics. WASK offered sandwiches and fruit as people circulated among booths and tables filled with information about housing, employment, physical and mental health, nutrition, substance use treatment and other significant issues.

#### **Open Forum Listening Sessions**

Since mid-October, the Lighthouse hosts a small group of local service providers. On Tuesday mornings from 10 until lunch time, a dozen individuals confer on available services. More importantly, they invite input from dining room guests. The group has found it invaluable to hear what might be helpful from those most likely to benefit from social services. Members of the listening group have included city council members, state representatives, Waterville's mayor, police and fire chiefs, case managers from local agencies, and local healthcare providers.

#### Art Workshop

"Together" is a project of Damariscotta artist Peter Bruun, sponsored by Waterville Creates. Peter is working with multiple groups within the community, including patrons of the Lighthouse, to artistically express their own experiences of 'community'. Given a prompt, participants explore their ideas through art. The Lighthouse is a prominent feature of several pieces. The group meets after lunch on Tuesday afternoons.



### **Emergency Warming Center**

Waterville's Public Safety Chiefs have been constructing a plan for winter emergencies, with particular attention to the impact on our unhoused community. As the Mid-Maine Homeless Shelter takes responsibility to ensure that no one is unsheltered overnight, WASK has been approached to assist with daytime shelter.

The Lighthouse is currently open 8am until 12:30pm. We intend to offer additional hours of warm shelter, until emergency beds are available at 8pm. Adding an additional 7 hours of operation will require community support. The city has put out a call for volunteers to help staff this warming shelter and meet other needs.
